**Program Admissions Information:**

Students must have a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of at least a 2.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale.

Students completing the Associate in Arts (AA) and/or the Associate of Science (AS) degree programs are eligible for transfer with junior status.

Students completing the Associate in Applied Arts (AAS) degree program must complete general education core courses as part of the requirements for the undergraduate degree program. A course-by-course evaluation will be completed for all courses designated as college transfer credits with a grade of “C” or better.

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### **College-Level Foreign Language Requirement:**

Foreign language classes are not required for this program. It is recommended that a foreign language class be considered for an elective course completion for this program.

### **Admission to Educator Preparation Program**

For students pursuing the Child Development, Early Education and Family Studies (Birth – Kindergarten) concentration, admission to Educator Preparation Program (EPP) is required. Students must meet the following criteria:

- Obtain cumulative GPA of 2.8 or higher
- Pass PRAXIS Core exam or earn exemption (based on SAT or ACT scores)
- Criminal Background Check
- 30 semester hours or more
- Obtain minimum grade of “C” (2.0) must be earned in all courses
