<sup>4</sup>Students must take a course from the approved Social and Behavioral Sciences General Education course list other than any HIST courses applied toward the major (may take HIST 103, HIST 216, HIST 231).

<sup>5</sup> Students must take a course from the approved Global Awareness General Education course list other than any HIST courses applied to the major (may take HIST 130, HIST 216, HIST 231).

<sup>6</sup> Students must take a course from the approved Scientific Reasoning (SR) Non-Lab General Education course list and should discuss options with their adviser.

<sup>7</sup> 18 hrs. Including **THREE HOURS** in each of the following **SIX** areas: US, African American, Latin American, Europe, Asia, and Africa (not including any required history courses).

<sup>8</sup> 12hrs. Students may take any Criminal Justice, Geography, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology, or Anthropology courses for which they meet the prerequisites.

<sup>9</sup>13hrs. Students may take any course at the University for which they meet the prerequisites.

<sup>10</sup> Students must take **SIX HOURS** of the same language.
